STATE OF THE HEART CURRICULUM

HOW CHILDREN LEARN IS AS IMPORTANT AS WHAT THEY LEARN

Stamford American's early learning preschool curriculum at The Early Learning Village is guided by the USA Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework, which outlines the skills, behaviors and developmentally-appropriate milestones to foster the growth of young learners from birth.

Teacher-initiated experiences are planned by highly skilled staff with extensive expertise in child development. Children are given opportunities to express themselves through exploratory, investigative, and imaginative play, which can be enjoyed either cooperatively or independently. Child-initiated and teacher guided experiences enhance language development, social competence, creativity, imagination, and thinking skills.

Pre-Nursery and Nursery curriculum (for children 18 months to 2 years old) draws on the Creative Curriculum® from Teaching Strategies Gold. This program supports active learning and developmentally appropriate goals and objectives for children across domains of learning including social/emotional, physical, cognitive and language

Pre-K and KG2 curriculum (for children aged 3 to 6 years old) is grounded in the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (IB PYP) integrated with new Units of Inquiry. The early year's PYP is a holistic learning experience that integrates socio-emotional, physical and cognitive development and takes place in dynamic environments that promote play, discovery and exploration.



Our education model incorporates the six subject investigations as a way to ensure every day moments are aligned to essential discovery and learning, and are woven into the Units of Inquiry as they progress through their years of early learning.

GIVE YOUR CHILD THE GIFT OF PERSONALIZED CARE

Infant Care:

FROM 2 TO 18 MONTHS

Following the principles of the RIE philosophy, our Infant Care program supports the development of an authentic child who feels secure, autonomous, competent, and connected.

Pre-Nursery:

FROM 18 MONTHS TO 2 YEARS

Creating a seamless transition into your child's first schooling experience, sensitively separating them from their primary caregiver.

Nursery:

FROM 2 TO 3 YEARS

Gradual encouragement to make independent play choices and enjoy uninterrupted opportunities to explore new things. Teachers guide important language development through modelling.

Pre-Kindergarten:

FROM 3 TO 4 YEARS

Introduction to the Primary Years Program with the Units of Inquiry to stimulate the developing intellect. Suzuki music emphasis with the aim of nurturing musical aptitude and developing fine motor skills.

Kindergarten 1:

FROM 4 TO 5 YEARS

Consolidate learning in preparation for Elementary, through carefully planned Inquiry Learning Centers which tap into the conceptual gains of this age.

Kindergarten 2:

FROM 5 TO 6 YEARS

Sets the standards and expectations of Elementary, where students transition from play-based learning into more structured learning. Increase in the Units of Inquiry, specialist time, and rigor throughout all subjects.

FLEXIBLE HOURS

The Freedom Of A Tailored Schedule

Our flexible daily and weekly options give you the opportunity to design the early years school week to suit your family's needs. Friendly early learners staff will greet your child when they arrive on your chosen days, at your chosen times.

Options offered vary across Infant Care to Kindergarten 1 in line with demand. Kindergarten 2 is required to attend 5 full days per week to access the elementary curriculum.

SPECIALIST PROGRAMS

ENSURING ACADEMIC SUCCESS

We recognize the importance of allowing children to be children. To that end, a range of specialist programs are offered with Stamford American's Early Years curriculum, designed to enhance language development, social competence, creativity, imagination, and thinking skills.

LANGUAGES

Emboldening our future citizens of the world

DAILY MANDARIN OR SPANISH FROM 18 MONTHS

Being multilingual delivers key advantages for global citizenship. Starting in Pre-Nursery, we offer daily Mandarin or Spanish instruction taught by native speaking education specialists in a dedicated language learning environment.

BILINGUAL MANDARIN/ENGLISH FROM AGE 3

For families seeking more comprehensive Mandarin instruction for their children, we offer the Mandarin/ English Bilingual Program commencing in Pre-Kindergarten. It's the same curriculum as that taught in the monolingual classes, with the only difference being the language in which it's taught, with the Bilingual Program dividing learning time between Mandarin and English.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL) FROM AGE 5

English as an Additional Language (EAL) is a language program designed to encourage greater confidence in students' English language ability. As children complete Kindergarten 1 at age 4 to 5 they are individually assessed for their English proficiency prior to entering Kindergarten 2, and are encouraged to join the program if there is an identified need.

THE ARTS (MUSIC AND VISUAL ARTS)

Communication beyond the spoken word

Visual arts at the Village supports the development of creative skills, verbal and nonverbal expression and awareness of the perspectives of others, as well as aesthetic appreciation.

Music in Nursery consists of singing, movement and un-tuned percussion instrument play. This foundation stage leads to more a formalized Pre-K to KG2 music curriculum, where students participate in PYP music classes and study the Suzuki Violin method.

SPECIALIST PHYSICAL EDUCATION

A child in motion is a child learning

Movement is at the core of how children's brains develop, which is why physical education is an important part of the Village school curriculum.

'SMART STEPS' FROM 18 MONTHS

The SMART Steps program, built into our curriculum from Pre-Nursery and designed by well-known educator Ms. Gill Connell, enhances key movement patterns essential for successful body and brain development.

PERCEPTUAL MOTOR PROGRAM (PMP)

At age 5 children progress to the Perceptual Motor Program (PMP), which further develops fundamental skills essential to classroom success. PMP assesses each child's skill development on a weekly basis, working to build ability that supports reading, writing, focus, perceptual awareness and attention development.

PHYSICAL, SOCIAL AND PERSONAL EDUCATION (PSPE)

PSPE at Stamford American is centered around the development of the whole student. Our diverse curriculum promotes students' understanding of how to maintain healthy and meaningful relationships with others, allows them to develop an understanding of who they are, and encourages participation and active lifestyles.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Nurturing interests and abilities beyond academia

True to our ethos of providing holistic education from the heart, we offer varied co-curricular activities (CCA) for playful fun and stimulation, as well as allowing young children to discover a new sport or hobby to enjoy from their early years.

With a dedicated 40-minute block daily, activities are conducted on a single campus with 12 specialist multifunctional spaces both indoor and out, with features including a child height ballet barre, timber floors and large round viewing windows. There's even an outdoors sports turf and safe rubber surfaced square for endless enrichment fun.



BEYOND THE CLASSROOM LEARNING

Excursions & incursions for real life lessons

In the Early Years, each grade extends classroom learning with both excursions and incursions, where special guests and activities are brought into the classroom learning experience. Through these well-thought-out experiences, students make real world connections to ideas and concepts explored in the classroom.

Innovation

DELIVERING DIGITAL FAMILIARITY

The integration of Innovation as a concept early on gives Stamford American students a distinctive advantage in life. Every grade level has an "innovation kit" used to engage students in learning experiences across the curriculum. Students use tools such as Virtual Reality Kits, BeeBot robots and Makey Makeys to learn about Math, Language Arts and UOI topics, among others. This is supported with 1:1 iPad Program for children from Kindergarten 2 onwards.

Early Years Library

FOR THE LOVE OF READING

The focus of Stamford American's Early Learning Library is to develop a love of reading, to promote wide-ranging literacy skills, and to support the classroom curriculum. Weekly lessons with the Librarian incorporate essential components of early childhood literacy through the sharing of and interaction with quality literature.

Mealtime

FAMILY-STYLE LUNCHES

With its communal setting, children are taught table manners as well as mindfulness, whilst exploring different cultures through food. A dedicated dietician helps with planning the weekly menu and meals are prepared within a fully equipped allergen kitchen. Meals are nutritionally balanced for all children's individual needs.

Assessment & Reporting

BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF YOUR CHILD'S PROGRESS

Assessment plays a vital role in nurturing and teaching young children. Our teachers carefully monitor children's learning using the GOLDTM Assessment system, which is an authentic, ongoing observational system for monitoring children's progress and development. Teachers purposefully record these observations in order to understand each child and make decisions about how to best support his or her development and learning. In the Primary Years Program, teachers conduct ongoing formative and summative assessment to challenge and exhibit students' learning.

Report Cards for Early Years students are issued at the end of each semester and provide a detailed summary of students' achievements along with teachers' comments. Conferences (student led with Parent & Teacher) occur throughout the year for more detailed discussions on the progress each child is making. Parents can expect to be invited to meet their respective teachers or may request a meeting at their discretion.
